Clarification for SSI income and the revision of the base period for counting Child

Support income in the Integrated Eligibility Manual

The purpose of this memorandum is to clarify that Supplemental Security Income (SSI) remains non-countable income for the Subsidized Child Care (SCC) Program and the base period for calculating Child Support income has been changed to a three month base period to align with other programs.

Due to an inadvertent error the exclusion for not counting SSI income for Subsidized Child Care did not appear in the Integrated Eligibility Manual (IEM). The IEM has been pulled offline while this and other minor errors are being corrected. The IEM will be reposted soon.

Also, the base period for calculating Child Support income has been revised to align with the other means tested programs. The base period revision to a three month period is effective immediately for all new applications, redeterminations or when a change is reported. SCC will align all base periods for countable income with all programs as stated in the IEM.
